➡ STREET OPERATIONS DEPARTMENT

SWEEPING

Street sweepers are currently performing their annual spring clean-up. During this time, crews will sweep each street in the city once. After clean-up is completed, crews will move to their regular summer sweeping schedule.

Regular sweeping schedule:

- Monday: Northend
- Tuesday: East Side
- Wednesday: Fairway
- Thursday: West Side

PATCHING

The Street Operations crew will be patching potholes and curb lines throughout the City in preparation for upcoming pavement management projects. This may require intermittent lane closures and possible temporary road closures as work is performed. Motorists are advised to use caution and expect delays in these areas.

➡ WATER DEPARTMENT

WATER LINE INSTALLATION – GARRETT WY, MADISON AVE, COLORADO AVE. & MAPLE ST.

Beginning Thursday, March 21, 2024, for approximately 8 weeks, crews from the City of Pocatello Water Department will be replacing the water main line on Garrett Way, Madison Avenue, Colorado Avenue, and Maple Street. The project will start at the intersection of W. Maple St. and N. 1st Ave, continuing northwest toward Colorado Avenue. The Project will begin again from the intersection of Garrett Way and Colorado Avenue continuing southeast towards Madison Avenue. Crews will work between the hours of 6:30 AM to approximately 5:00 PM, Monday through Thursday. During the project, access to the construction area will be restricted and sections of the street will be completely closed while workers are digging. Every effort will be made to provide local access to the area when possible. Parking will also be restricted in the construction zone and residents are asked to park all vehicles away from the area during working hours. At the close of each day, access will be restored to all properties.

ANNUAL HYDRANT FLUSHING PROGRAM

The City of Pocatello Water Department will be conducting their annual hydrant flushing program beginning Monday, May 20, 2024 and will take approximately three weeks to complete. If you see a crew flushing a hydrant on your street, we recommend you avoid running tap water or using the washing machine or dishwasher until flushing is completed. If you see hydrant-flushing crews working, please drive carefully and treat them like any other road construction crew.

➔ WATER POLLUTION CONTROL

SEWER MAINLINE MAINTENANCE

Crews will be jetting and cleaning sewer mainlines throughout the City. Motorists may experience delays or lane closures while crews are performing the work. Please be advised to use caution.

➔ IDAHO TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT

I-86/I-15 SYSTEM INTERCHANGE PROJECT

Beginning Wednesday, August 10, 2022, Chubbuck Rd. will be closed between Pleasant View Dr. and Fairgrounds Rd. as part of the I-86/I-15 System Interchange project. This portion of Chubbuck Rd. will remain closed until Fall 2024 for roadway and bridge construction activities. A detour directing traffic around the closure via New Day Parkway/Northgate Parkway is in operation. ➔ CONTRACTORS

SUNROC CORPORATION – HAWTHORNE RD. AND W. QUINN RD.

Sunroc Corporation is installing signal poles at the intersection of Hawthorne Road and W. Quinn Road. There will be intermittent lane closures. Motorists are advised to use caution and anticipate potential delays in the area as the intersection is operating as a 4-way stop while the signal poles are being installed.

CANNON BUILDERS – CENTER STREET UNDERPASS

The Center Street underpass is scheduled to undergo structural work on the ingress/egress retaining walls from April to late October 2024. As a result, the underpass will be closed during this period. We request you to kindly plan your travel and use alternate routes while the construction is in progress. The contractor will make efforts to keep a pedestrian route open. However, please note that it will be an active construction zone, so exercise caution while entering the area.

SUPERIOR ASPHALT – ALAMEDA RD.

On Wednesday, May 22, 2024 from 8-5 pm, Superior Asphalt will be repairing asphalt for the City of Pocatello on E. Alameda Rd. There will be intermittent lane closures on E. Alameda Rd from Willard Ave to Park Ave. Motorists are advised to use caution and expect delays in the area.

PLANNED AND ENGINEERED CONSTRUCTION

Planned and Engineered Construction (PEC) will begin the CIPP lining work throughout the city for the sanitary sewer mainline rehab. The project is expected to take approximately 3 weeks. This may require intermittent lane closures as work is performed. Motorists are advised to use caution in these areas.

CITY OF CHUBBUCK – VENTURE WAY

The City of Chubbuck will be creating a pothole to get depth of Simplot Slurry Line in eastbound travel lane of Venture Lane. They will be replacing asphalt with cold mix. Hot mix will be provided after installation of new waterline. There will be intermittent lane closures as work is performed. Motorists are advised to use caution and expect delays in the area.

POCATELLO FOOD TRUCK ROUND-UP

PORTNEUF VALLEY FARMERS MARKET

Historic Downtown Pocatello is hosting the “Portneuf Valley Farmers Market” every Saturday from 6:00 AM – 3:00 PM beginning May 4 through October 26, 2024. The event is located at the 100 block of S. Garfield Ave. in front of the Marshall Public Library. This area will be closed during the above-referenced times. Motorists are advised to use caution and expect delays in the area.

LAW ENFORCEMENT TORCH RUN

The Pocatello Police Department will be holding Torch Run in support of the Special Olympics on Wednesday, May 22, 2024, from 4:30 PM – 6:00 PM. The run is expected to have approx. 50 officers participating. It will begin at the Swanson Arch area and conclude at Caldwell Park. There will be temporary road closures on S. 7th Ave from E. Carter St. to E. Lewis St. Motorists are advised to use caution and expect delays in these areas.
