

What Makes a Plant Firewise?


- * \$mall stature
- *Water content
- Lack of resin
- *Saponin content
- Drought tolerant

How do I Choose Plants?



BLM fire resistance score (1-10)
Based on size, succulence, resin content,
saponin content

Using the Fire Resistance Score



*8=10 suitable for zone 1 *5=10 suitable for zone 2 *1=10 suitable for zone 3

Succulents for Zone 1

- Prickly pear (Opuntia spp.)
- > Autumn stonecrop (Sedum telephium)
- Hardy iceplant
 (Delosperma nubigena)



Rosy pussytoes Antennaria rosea)

Groundcovers for Zone 1

- Poppy mallow (Callirhoe involucrata)
- > \$now=in=\$ummer (Cerastium tomentosum)
- Ornamental strawberry (Frageria spp.)
- Rock soapwort (Saponaria ocymoides)
- False rockesress (Aubrieta deltoidea)



Perennials for Zone 1

- Rocky Mtn Columbine (Aquilegia coerulea)
- Nodding onion (Allium cernuum)
- Pink tickseed (Coreopsis rosea)
- Wallflower (Erysimum linifolium)
- Bloody cranesbill (Geranium striatum)



Perennials for Zone 1

- Blanketflower
 (Gaillardia aristata)
- Daylily (Hemerocallis hybrids)
- > Hosta (*Hosta* spp.)
- Liriope (Liriope spicata)
- Oriental poppy (Papaver orientale)



Perennials for Zone 1

- Blue flax (Linum lewisii)
- Twilight primrose (Oenothera berlandieri)
- Pine-leaf penstemon (Penstemon pinifolius)
- > Rocky Mtn penstemon (Penstemon strictus)

Are Firewise and Waterwise Mutually Exclusive?

No - Requires Balance

- Choose plants with limited dormancy
- Irrigate enough to keep landscape green
